Supply Disruption: Diamorphine Hydrochloride 5mg and 10mg ampoules.

Dear Colleagues,

On the 25th March 2020, the DHSC advised healthcare professionals to make the recommended actions originally communicated on 26th February 2020(SDA/2020/003) in relation to the supply disruption of Diamorphine Hydrochloride 5mg and 10mg ampoules, permanent. This recommendation is in response to firm indication from the two suppliers of diamorphine 5mg and 10mg in the UK, Wockhardt and Accord, that supply will remain unpredictable for the foreseeable future.

Permanent recommendations:

- Given the continuing unpredictability of supply of diamorphine, both primary and secondary care should now use Morphine sulfate solution for injection as first-line where clinically appropriate. Shropshire CCG recommends the use of Morphine Sulfate 15mg/ml solution for injection as an alternative to diamorphine. https://www.shropshireccg.nhs.uk/media/2571/just-in-case-drug-lists.pdf
- Morphine and diamorphine are not equipotent, and great care should be taken when switching patients or amending guidelines
