INFORMATION TO CANDIDATES - SUMMARY OF MAIN TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

The following information is intended as a useful guide to applicants considering joining the Hospice. Full details are supplied with an offer of appointment.

1. MEDICAL

As part of the Hospice's selection procedure for employment, we ask all prospective employees to complete a pre-employment medical questionnaire. The purpose is to fulfil our responsibilities under the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and to ensure that the proposed employment does not present any particular risks from a medical point of view.

No formal offer of appointment will be made until the Hospice, through its Occupational Health Service Provider, is satisfied about your medical fitness to undertake the job. Further details about this will be sent to any prospective employee following interview.

2. REFERENCES

No formal offer of employment will be made until we have received satisfactory references.

3. DISCLOSURE

Not applicable

4. PROBATIONARY PERIOD

Your appointment will initially be for a probationary period of up to 6 months during which time your progress will be regularly assessed. Your line manager will work closely with you in order to help and support you as necessary throughout your probationary period. The Hospice reserves the right to extend the probationary period for any reason should this be deemed necessary eg. to provide additional training.

Your appointment will be confirmed in writing following the satisfactory completion of your probationary period. Your employment may be terminated at any time during the probationary period with appropriate notice. However, prior to this decision being made, every effort will be made to ensure that you reach the required standards.

5. SALARY

The hourly rate for this post is **£8.96**

6. HOURS OF WORK

You will be contracted to work 15 hours per week

7. HOLIDAY

Holiday entitlement is 7 weeks per annum including bank holidays.

8. PENSION

The Hospice is able to offer ex NHS staff continuity of membership* into the NHS Superannuation Scheme. Please note, as a direction employer, the Hospice is not able to provide access to the NHS (Compensation for Premature Retirement) Regulations or the NHS (Injury Benefits) Regulations. All other NHS Superannuation scheme benefits are applicable.

Severn Hospice Equality and Diversity Statement

Severn Hospice (the Hospice) is committed to the equal treatment of all employees and job applicants and requires all staff, whatever their grade or authority, to abide by this general principle. The Hospice is committed to all employees being able to achieve their full potential in an environment characterised by dignity and mutual respect.

No individual shall be treated less favourably than another on grounds of gender, age, religion or belief, marital status, race, nationality, ethnic or national origin, sexual orientation, disability, social background, trade union membership, criminal record, carer responsibilities or employment status. Candidates are selected for interview based on their skills, qualifications and experience.

A DBS Check is only requested after a thorough risk assessment has indicated that one is both proportionate and relevant to the position concerned. For those positions where a DBS Check is required, all application packs will contain a statement that a Check will be requested in the event of the individual being offered the post.

Details of criminal records must be sent under separate, confidential cover with your application form. We guarantee that this information will only be seen by those who need to see it as part of the recruitment process.

All those involved in the recruitment process have been suitably trained to identify and assess the relevance and circumstances of offences. At interview, an open and measured discussion will take place on the subject of any offences or other matter that might be relevant to the position.

Criminal records will be taken into account for recruitment purposes only when the conviction is relevant. Having an “unspent” conviction will not necessarily bar you from employment. This will depend on the nature of the position and the circumstances and background of your offences. However, any “unspent” convictions, which are not declared and subsequently revealed, may result in dismissal.

Under the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974, a conviction will become “spent” (i.e. treated as if it had not occurred) where the individual has not, after a specified period of time, committed another serious offence.

Rehabilitation periods vary depending on the type and length of conviction originally incurred.

Severn Hospice has a legal obligation to protect vulnerable client groups from people who have committed serious offences, and as such meets the requirements in respect of exempted questions under the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974. All applicants who are offered employment in a post that falls into this category will be subject to a Disclosure Barring Service Check, before the appointment is confirmed. This will include details of cautions, reprimands or final warnings, as well as convictions, including “spent” convictions and where the post is subject to an Enhanced Check, other relevant non-conviction information, such as police enquiries and pending prosecutions will be included.

Severn Hospice is committed to compliance with the Disclosure Barring Service’s Code of Practice for Registered Persons and other recipients of DBS information.

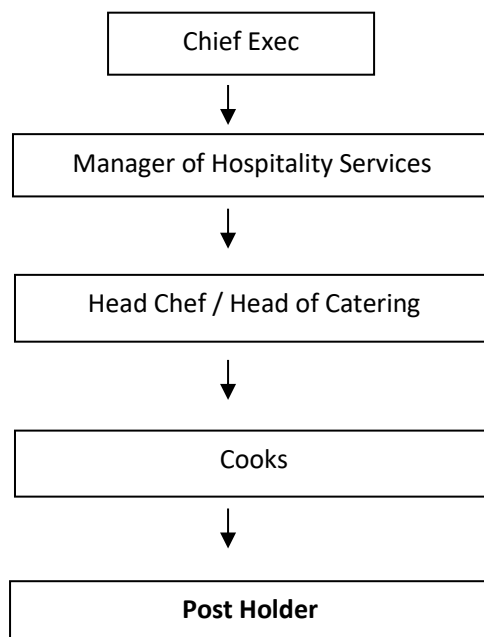

Post Title:	Catering Assistant
Reports to:	Head Chef / Head of Catering
Purpose of the post:	The job holder will be a member of the team providing a catering service throughout the organisation to patients, their relatives, staff, voluntary workers and visitors.

PRINCIPAL RESPONSIBILITIES

The Catering Assistant will work directly under the control of the Head Chef / Head of Catering and Cook and will give assistance as follows: -

- Preparation of tables in dining room at meal times.
- Assisting in the preparation of meals as required.
- Assisting in the preparation of items to be sold in the living well café.
- Assisting in the service of staff and patients' meals in accordance with general policy as and when required.

- Interacting with Patients when needed to establish meal requirements
- Washing up of all used crockery, utensils and operation of the dishwashing machine.
- Collection and removal of waste materials and cleanliness of waste containers.
- Ensuring cleanliness of all working surfaces in the kitchen.
- Ensuring cleanliness of all floors and wall surrounds within accessible reach.
- Any other duties given by the Head Chef / Head of catering / Cook
- Additionally, the post holder will:
 - Work in accordance with duty rotas and work schedules. It is important to note that this includes weekends and bank holidays on a rota basis, and some shifts will involve working alone and unsupervised.
 - Be responsible for practising good hygiene in all aspects of the working of the Catering Department, including maintaining a good standard of personal and general hygiene.
 - Use kitchen equipment in accordance with relevant operating instructions.
 - Ensure correct use of all cleaning materials.
 - Ensure compliance at all times with the Hospice's Health & Safety Policy.
 - To maintain good working relationships within the department and with other staff.

This job description is intended as a guide to the range of duties covered and should not be regarded as inflexible. There is a mutual obligation to modify the description when changes in the work situation occur.

Supplementary Information and Requirements

All Hospice employees are on a 6 months probationary period.

Health and Safety
